IVE Business Students Sweep Awards in Yeung Kin Man Youth Industrial Incubation Programme Award Presentation Ceremony cum Sharing Session 2025

22 August 2025

The "Yeung Kin Man Youth Industrial Incubation Programme Award Presentation Ceremony cum Sharing Session" was held on 22 August 2025 at the Hong Kong Institute of Vocational Education to celebrate student achievements. The programme organised activities in the 2024/25 academic year, including industrial talks, a visit to Huizhou, and project competitions, focusing on artificial intelligence, smart manufacturing, and digital transformation. We are proud to highlight the top three award-winning teams in this year's programme from the Hong Kong Institute of Vocational Education (Kwun Tong) for their exceptional project work. The Champion Team, comprising students from the Higher Diploma in Professional Accountancy, earned top honors for their project titled "How Can Café de Coral Respond to the Impact of Declining Local Consumer

Spending Power". Their insightful analysis also won them the Best Presentation Award. The First Runner-Up was awarded to a team from the Higher Diploma in Human Resources and Talent Analytics for their project "How to Improve Training and Development of Clubhouse Frontline Staff in Kai Shing Management Services Limited". Their impactful work impressed the judges and also secured Third Prize in the Best Video Competition. The Second Runner-Up went to the team from the Higher Diploma in Event Marketing and Business Promotion, who explored "Increasing Visitor Numbers of IMXpo Through Social Media". Their strategic approach earned them the Best Written Report Award as well. These achievements reflect the students' creativity, collaboration, and commitment to excellence in applying their skills to real-world challenges.

ACCA Community Day 2025
