Key initiatives under the partnership include delivering specialised training through collaborative programmes, and enriching curriculum content to offer students more comprehensive and robust learning support.



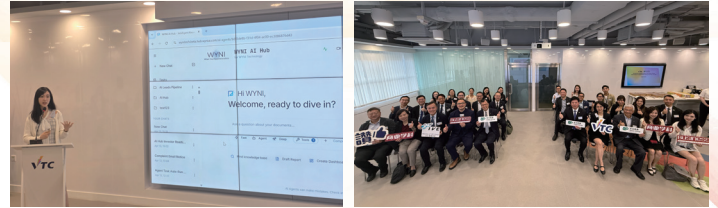
VTC and Urban Group Forge Partnership to Advance Property Management Talent

Guest Lecture: Tugboats & Salvage Vessels — An Insight into the Maritime Industry

30 May 2026

While tugboats and salvage vessels represent a highly specialised and niche sector within the maritime industry, a recent guest lecture at IVE (Tsing Yi) offered students a fascinating look into this vital field. The event was particularly inspiring as it highlighted the growing impact of female leadership in a sector that has traditionally been male-dominated.

Ms. Angelina Lei, Chief Executive Officer of Hong Kong Salvage & Towage Services Limited, together with General Manager Mr. Stephen Chan and Operations Manager Mr. Tang Ka Kit, visited the campus to deliver an engaging guest lecture. The session attracted over 100 enthusiastic students from the HD in Aviation Services and Transport Studies and the HD in Aviation and Logistics programmes.

During the session, the speakers introduced the vital roles of tugboats and salvage vessels in supporting maritime operations and ensuring marine safety. Students learned about vessel specifications, including size and horsepower, as well as operational functions, service scope, industry developments, and future business opportunities. Ms. Lei also shared her inspiring career journey — from graduating from university and starting her career at a container terminal to becoming the CEO of a leading salvage and towage company. Her experience encouraged students to pursue their aspirations with confidence and determination.

Another highlight of the event was a career-sharing session by Ms. Violet Tang, Head of Human Resources at Hong Kong United Dockyards Group. She provided practical insights into the industry's recruitment requirements, career pathways, and current employment opportunities. Students participated enthusiastically in the discussion, asking thoughtful questions about career prospects and industry expectations. The strong interest generated by the session was reflected in the number of students who subsequently registered for job interviews arranged for the following week.

The lecture not only broadened students' understanding of the maritime industry but also showcased the diverse career opportunities available within the sector. By connecting with experienced professionals and learning from real-life industry experiences, students gained greater awareness of the skills, knowledge, and determination required to build successful careers in this dynamic field.



Guest Lecture about "PRIVATE JET!"

23 April 2026



While commercial aviation is familiar to most, the exclusive world of private jets remains a mystery to many. To shed light on this dynamic sector, Mr. Chicago Shum, Director of Charter Sales & Commercial Services at Phenix Jet, visited IVE (Tsing Yi) to deliver an inspiring guest lecture. The event drew over 160 enthusiastic students from HD in Aviation Services and Transport Studies and the HD in Aviation and Logistics programmes. All eager to explore this exciting, niche industry.

Mr. Shum retraced his impressive career trajectory, which spans both commercial aviation (including Hong Kong Express, Hong Kong Airlines, and Cathay Pacific) to the private jet industry (including TAG Aviation, Genting Hong Kong, and Crystal Fly Cruises). His current company, Phenix Jet, is a Japan-listed company that operates a fleet of 19 aircraft and ranks 8th in Asia Pacific region.

During the session, Mr Shum offered valuable insights into private jet operations, aircraft types, jet pricing, privileged services, industry history, business distribution, market development, as well as the latest industry trends and prospects. He placed special emphasis on the entry requirements for aspiring professionals, sparking great interest among the students. The lecture concluded with a lively Q&A session, where students actively raised questions about career pathways and the unique operational dynamics of private aviation.

Travelling across different districts, students gained valuable insights into the city's diverse urban landscape, architectural developments, transportation infrastructure, and community planning.

As the bus journeyed through key areas — including West Kowloon, Tsim Sha Tsui, Central, Mid-Levels, Hung Hom, Kowloon Tong, Fo Tan and Tai Po — students observed the distinctive character and development features of each district. The trip was made even more memorable by the breathtaking sunset views, showcasing Hong Kong's iconic skyline and harbourfront from a unique perspective.

One of the highlights of the tour was the exploration of the future Central Harbourfront development, including the emerging Central Yards project, which is set to become a vibrant landmark and a new focal point connecting business, leisure and cultural activities in the heart of Hong Kong.

The 11th Hong Kong Logistics Case Competition and Workshop

27 February - 1 March 2026

Three students from the HD in Aviation and Logistics of the Business Discipline from IVE (TY) actively participated in the Logistics Case Competition, organized by the Hong Kong Logistics Association (HKLA). This year's competition brought together a diverse group of talented students from leading institutions across the region, including Beijing, Shenzhen, Korea, Singapore and Thailand.

The competition includes an on-site visit to Hankyu Hanshin Express, allowing participants to gain deeper understanding of how logistics systems operate in a professional setting. On the second day, a Case Workshop was held, where students formed cross-institutional teams to foster cross-cultural communication and collaboration.





Renowned speakers from AFRC, Big 4 international accountancy firms and trade associations shared their expertise on key developments shaping the profession. The discussions covered vital industry topics, including regulatory updates, Environmental, Social, and Governance (ESG) standards, artificial intelligence (AI) integration, as well as the emerging opportunities and challenges within the Greater Bay Area (GBA).

The Accountancy Forum 2026 was successfully held at IVE (Kwun Tong), attracting over 1,200 in-person and online participants, including industry practitioners and students from the HD in Professional Accountancy programme. The forum was supported by 16 prestigious organizations including the Accounting and Financial Reporting Council (AFRC), The Hong Kong Institute of Certified Public Accountants (HKICPA) and the Association of Chartered Certified Accountants (ACCA) Hong Kong.
